Preparing For Installation

Read the Installation Manual

- If anyone involved in the installation process cannot read English, it is the owner's responsibility to explain the contents of this manual to them.
- If any portion of this manual is unclear, contact the White Shanty Customer Service Department for clarification.
- It is the owner's responsibility to be familiar with the use of any tools that may be necessary to complete the installation of this product. Read the manual for these specific tools.
- Do not install or allow anyone to install this product if there are any questions about the installation process.
- Never attempt to install this product if any of the components are damaged or have any unauthorized modifications.
- All persons should be trained. The owner is responsible for training the users.
- Wear the appropriate personal protective equipment during installation.
- Wear hearing protection.
- Wear safety glasses.
- Wear a dust mask to avoid breathing dust.
- Never allow children, unskilled or improperly trained people to participate in the installation process.
- Keep the Installation Manual legible and intact.
- Do not attempt to install this product while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Site Preparation

- Check the area where the product is to be installed.

- Only use components approved by the manufacturer.






Installation Preparation


- Do not tamper with any component.
- Use extra care when unloading or moving any component. Some components may be heavy and require multiple people to move them safely.
- Keep all fasteners such as nuts and bolts well secured.
- Verify that all components are in good condition and are not damaged in any way.
- Do not start the assembly process until you read the Installation Manual.
- Do not use the door(s) until the assembly process is complete.



Suspending the Installation Procession

- If it is necessary to suspend the installation process, it is the owner's responsibility to mark off the area to limit access until the installation is complete.
- Do not allow anyone to use the door(s) until the assembly process is complete.

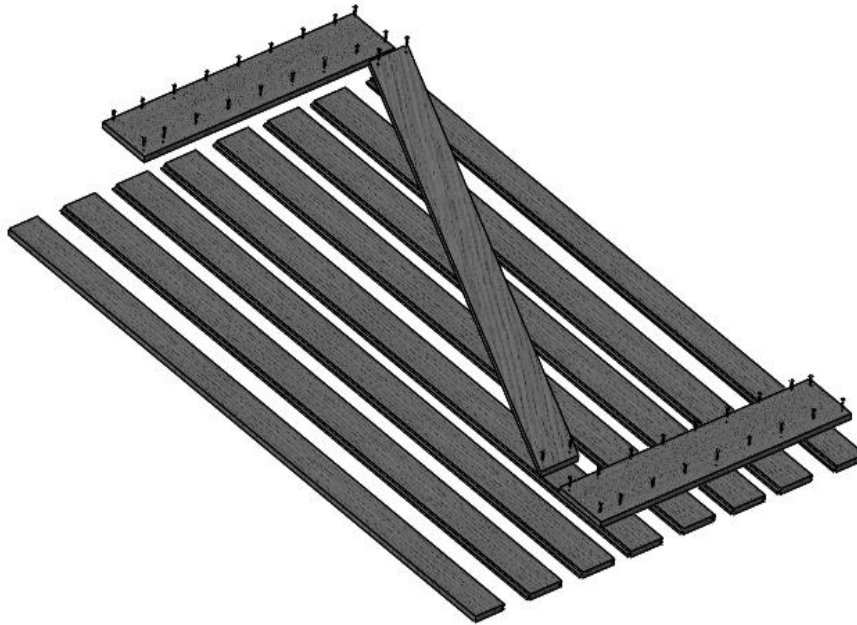

Board and Batten Door Assembly

1. Lay starter plank (1) flat on working surface.
2. Place the first center plank (2) next to the starter plank (1) so that the groove engages tongue of the starter plank.
3. Place another center plank (2) next to the previous center plank so that the groove engages the tongue.
4. Once all center planks have been installed, place the End Plank (3) next to the last center plank so that the groove of the End Plank engages the tongue of the Center Plank.
5. Check that all planks are tightly fit together.
6. Measure overall dimensions with a tape measure.
7. Lay top and bottom rails (4) onto the plank assembly. Clamp the top and bottom rails securely to the door.
8. Use the screws (A) in the pre drilled holes located in the rails. Start at the outside and work your way in when inserting screws. DO NOT OVER TIGHTEN!
9. Place face boards (5) (if applicable) onto the assembly and secure using screws (A).
10. The board and batten door assembly is complete.
